**WEEK IN THE DESERT:**  
 Gardening in the high desert requires patience and water. Here is a guide to help you determine if you are watering enough or too much.

**LAWNS:**

Spring 1-1 1/2 inches per week

Summer 2-3 inches per week

**SHRUBS:**

Spring 1 inch per week

Summer 2 inches per week

**LARGE TREES:**

Spring 2 inches per week

Summer 3 inches per week

**For new plantings, this amount of water is in addition to the Root Stimulator solution we recommend!**

**WHAT TO DO NOW....**

- Feed everything that has a long blooming season . We recommend **Fertilome's Rooting & Blooming** once a week. Do not fertilize during the hottest part of the day, early morning or late evening is best.
- Fertilize perennials after they bloom. If you did not apply **Osmocote 14-14-14** in the spring, do so now.
- Fertilize flowering shrubs after they finish blooming with **Fertilome Tree & Shrub**.







Keep your baskets and planters looking fresh all season. Occasionally trim broken and spent flowers to encourage blooming. Water regularly. Continue to fertilize with a water-soluble fertilizer such as Fertilome Rooting & Blooming once a week all season.

- Care for flowering plants by removing faded flowers and feeding with a complete fertilizer such as **Fertilome Systemic Rose & Flower Food**. This product will protect against insects and disease as well as fertilize your roses and flowering plants.
- Deep water trees and shrubs.
- Cut back Shasta Daisies, Lupines, and Delphiniums after the first flowering to encourage a second blooming.
- Fertilize your lawn for the second time. we recommend our **Summer Blend 20-8-12-9** packaged by Redman. An organic fertilizer option is **Cascade Natural**.

**Slowmound Mugo Pine** - The mugo pine you always hoped for is now here. This rugged, water-wise pine is finely textured with dense deep green foliage. Beautiful year-round, it produces many showy buds and matures to a wide, even shape that is naturally compact, working well in even the most confined areas. Grows 4 feet high and about 6 feet wide.

**Mops Mugo Pine** is another great choice for a dwarf mugo pine. It grows 3-5" a year, topping at 4 feet tall and wide. In the cold months of winter the foliage takes on a warm, golden hue.

## NOT YOUR ORDINARY CEDAR!!

**Dwarf Western Red Cedar**- "Gruene Kugel" is a slow growing globe-shaped mound with thick, coarse looking foliage. This unique plant has heavy textured foliage with bronze tips in the winter. Growth is mound-like 3' tall and 4' wide.
