Daffodils are a great choice for naturalizing an area as they are deer resistant and will bloom year after year. **Allium** is also deer-resistant. **Tulips** are "deer dessert", but make a wonderful show in a protected area or with proper deer deterrent. Don't forget those precious little **Crocus** that spring up through the snow. Use varieties that bloom at different times to prolong the spectacular display!

DIG, DROP, DONE!

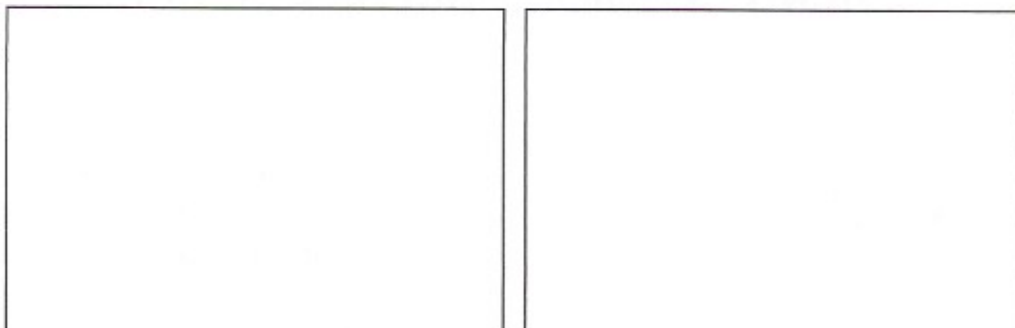


Bulbs... plant now and delight in their flower display next spring. Bulbs are among the easiest flowers to grow and also the most stunningly colorful to enjoy next spring.

Some Tips:

Plant spring flowering bulbs in the fall. These bulbs require the cold winter temperatures for development. All you need is a sunny spot, compost to mix with the soil, some bulb fertilizer, and the bulbs.

For best results, plant in clumps or large groups, rather than single rows.





DON'T FORGET THE GARLIC

Fall is the time to plant your garlic for next year. Our organic seed garlic is grown here in Bend. We have Chesnok

Red and Purple Majesty. It is best to use garlic grown especially for seeds as the "store" garlic may be treated to prevent sprouting. Plant the garlic cloves 6" apart and 2-3" deep.

Be creative. Garlic will produce tall slender foliage that will look great in a flower bed or planter!!



FALL GARDENING

Time to think about extending your gardening season with cool season plantings. Lettuces, kale, and spinach grow well in the cooler temperatures. Seeds will emerge quickly and fresh greens will soon be on your table!

OCTOBER IS THE TIME TO FERTILIZE!
